THIS NOTICE SHALL SATISFY THE ABOVE-CITED TWO SEPARATE BUT RELATED PROCEDURAL NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

On or about October 14, 2009, Bristol Township will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of Community Development Block Grant funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of, as amended, to undertake a project known as **Police Outreach Center** located at 5616 Mitchell Road, Levittown, Pennsylvania, for the purpose of providing an outreach center for the Bloomsdale-Fleetwing and Green Lawn Park neighborhood residents and children which will support ongoing Weed & Seed and Neighborhood Stabilization Program efforts.

Project Description: The project involves the purchase of a fully equipped 31-foot motor-home-type facility outfitted for use as a Police Substation and Outreach Center. The Outreach Center will be fully equipped and includes the design and installation of a concrete pad for the use of the Outreach Center. It is estimated to cost a total of \$94,000.

The police are active members of the Weed & Seed Steering Committee, coordinate with the Town Watch, and are active in the neighborhood, not just as law enforcement officers but also, offering social services and interaction with the children and adults of the community including problem solving and neighborhood clean up, sporting activities and insight into the activities of the police, especially by neighborhood youth. The center will allow a permanent place for these activities to occur along with readily available police protection and a safe haven in the neighborhoods. The Outreach Center will be strategically alternated between Green Lawn Park and Bloomsdale-Fleetwing, which are adjacent neighborhoods in the Weed and Seed Area. When not staffed, it will be moved to the Bristol Township Police Department Parking Area for security.

Bristol Township has determined that the above listed project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency disagreeing with the Bristol Township's determination or wishing to comment on the projects may submit written comments to Bristol Township Office of Community Development, Municipal Building, 2501 Bath Road, Bristol, Pennsylvania 19007. All comments received by October 13, 2009 will be considered by Bristol Township prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Commentors should specify which part of this Notice they are addressing.

RELEASE OF FUNDS

Bristol Township certifies to U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development that Samuel J. Fenton, in his capacity as Mayor/Executive, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities, and allows Bristol Township to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will consider objections to its release of funds and the Bristol Township certification received by October 30, 2009 or a period of fifteen days from its receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer or other officer of Bristol Township approved by HUD; (b) Bristol Township has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in a project have committed funds, incurred costs, or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58) and shall be addressed to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, The Wanamaker Building, 100 Penn Square East, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania 19107-3380, Attention: Regional Environmental Officer. Potential objectors should contact HUD to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
